We told you Eva's story in our May 2019 Newsletter. On 11 June 2019, Eva finally had her cataracts operation on both eyes and her sight has been restored. The vet re-assessed her on Sunday, 9 June for her pre-op and confirmed that Eva's sight was very poor indeed and appeared to have been so for some



time. We'd like to thank everyone who donated towards her treatment, the amazing vets at The K2 Veterinary Hospital in Sfântu Gheorghe, Romania and to Janie Gill, Eva's new mum in the UK who already has Lori from us.



SCARLETT, JULIA, GEM AND SILVANA

Introducing Scarlett, Silvana, Julia and Gem who joined us at RACE on 7 June, straight from the public shelter. All had a death sentence hanging over them. Silvana is very underweight and was so scared that she initially tried to bite us if we went to touch her. She was covered in fleas and ticks which have now been treated. Silva a is two years old (DOB: 20 March 2017). Overnight she became Nelu's best friend and



shadow. Dear sweet Julia was so very hungry on arrival here that she tried to attack any dog that went near to her. Julia was extremely malnourished, full of worms and infested with fleas. The information we received from the shelter was that she was so stressed that she chewed her tail away. However, since being here it was clear that her tail was cruelly amputated as she has not shown any interest in her tail at all. There's infection there which is now being treated. Julia is three years old



(DOB: 20 October 2016). Julia is a sweetheart and now she is receiving regular food, she has completely calmed down. She's mixing with the other dogs and plays on the yard with them. Elena has her sleeping in the house where she has taken up residence in the dog basket next to dear Dino. She has the loveliest, affectionate nature despite what she's suffered.

Quiet, gentle Gem is eight years old (DOB: 10 September 2011). She was suffering from a virus when she came to us which had also affected her eyes. Gem immediately received the correct treatment for this. She too was totally infested with fleas and, after worming, she was producing the longest tapeworms we have ever seen! The one in the photo is 22 inches long! It's so tragic to think this gentle dog and her puppies were sent to end their lives in a public shelter. Sadly, Gem's

babies, didn't survive their ordeal.

Three year old Scarlett (DOB: 20 February 2016) was absolutely terrified. This poor baby was also infested with fleas and ticks which have been treated. Scarlett is emaciated but is eating well here. She has been given her own comfort zone which has really helped her to relax. Our girl has been happily wandering around the courtyard getting to know our other dogs. It will take time and patience in an attempt to win her trust. At present she still tries to nip us if she's not too sure. Who knows what horrors this girl has suffered? But it all changes from hereon.

LORD AND LEA (DOB: 1 April 2019)



Lea, a Carpathian Shepherd X GSD, and sibling, Lord, a GSD Cross, were abandoned outside the home of Ioana Ungureanu, an avid animal lover who lives in Busteni. Ioana is also the Good Samaritan who helped Ollie, Elsa and Scout - three dogs abandoned in the harsh winter weather in the town. RACE successfully rehomed all three in the UK. Lord and Lea, were just two months old at the time they were so callously dumped. Ioana has kindly been fostering the little pair until Elena has some capacity to bring them to her home. Elena and Sue visited the pups back in early June, who are affectionate, strong and healthy - Ioana has done them proud, they are looking amazing. Both are extremely affectionate, well socialised AND cat friendly. Lord and Lea will be ready to travel when they reach four months old.



BEBE

On the 1 June, in the middle of the day, a local gypsy came to Elena's with a tiny kitten. They told us she was having epileptic fits and that they didn't know what to do with her. The story was also that one of the local vets refused to treat her, but this is not necessarily the case ... she was so very tiny and it wasn't necessary epilepsy.

Issy and her pups had been abandoned in a field not far from Elena's village back at the beginning of June. We discovered they had been there for a few days, but no one thought to alert Elena until local children had taken Issy's puppies. The poor mum was beside herself and stayed rooted to the spot - possibly in the hope they would come back. Issy was soon safely under Elena's roof, but despite putting the word around, the puppies were nowhere to be found. We dread to think of what befell these poor innocent souls. Issy is a Teckel cross aged four years old; she has probably produced many puppies over those years. She is extremely gentle and would love to have a nice, quiet home of her own where she could be properly cared for, instead of being the carer.

Bebe's eyes were very mucky, she was obviously malnourished and generally not the healthiest looking kitten. Nelu witnessed Bebe having a fit while Elena and Sue were out together on the Sunday. On Monday morning, she had another in the kitchen in front of Elena and Sue. Following the seizure, she devoured food like it was going out of fashion. We took Bebe, along with Eva to have her eyes reassessed and Maya who was losing weight rapidly, to the veterinary hospital in Sfântu Gheorghe. On examination, he said that it was due to her being so malnourished and also because of the heavy worm burden she was carrying. Elena had wormed her shortly after her arrival, which was taking effect. However, the migration of the dead worms can affect a kittens organs and cause seizures; we were assured that these would pass. Bebe was listless, grumpy and covered in scratches, the result of the fits as she was hitting out at her face. Her last fit was on Friday, 7 June ... we prayed all weekend that it would be an end to them ... and it was! By Tuesday, 11 June, we really thought Bebe had turned a corner. She was actually playing with the other rescue kittens we had, Lucy and Ruby, and exploring all over the house. Late on Thursday night, 14 June, Bebe had the worst seizure yet ... it went on for two hours. Elena was beside herself. There are no all night emergency vets in the area at all, so she did what she could be taking her to bed and comforting her. A frantic call to the veterinary hospital the following morning was made and Bebe was soon on Diazepam to help alleviate the fits. Sadly, Bebe went into a coma during the early hours of 16 June, and passed away. A tiny soul who made such a huge impact on us all here at RACE. Fly high baby angel.

Two more precious little angels joined RACE on 26 June ... introducing ten week old Carpathian sisters, Nela and Lilly. Elena's husband, Nelu, spotted them today when he was out working - unceremoniously dumped between two villages. More innocents born into this World only to be cast aside like rubbish ... words fail us - they really do. WHY is there such a complete absence of compassion in some people?



On the evening of 16 June, Elena and Nelu made the long journey from their home to a town in the mountains called Busteni. They were collecting Lea and Lord from Ioana, their rescuer and foster mum as, following successful adoptions, they now had the space for them. However, instead of returning with two pups as anticipated, they came back with five! Locals had found three tiny puppies who had been abandoned in the woods by the side of the road. Buttons and his two sisters travelled home with Elena and Nelu. A colleague from another rescue kindly offered to take the two girls on and rehome them once they were old enough ... Buttons is with RACE. It transpired that this little lad was harbouring the deadly Parvovirus; we're sad to say that he lost his fight for survival on 25 June 2019.

Violet was just six weeks old when she was found abandoned underneath Elena's car on 12 June. She had either been placed there very late during the night or very early in the morning. Whoever left her there had no thought of this little one's safety. There are many wild animals around the roaming

outskirts of the villages at night and she could so easily have been attacked. Sadly, this was the case for her sibling who was found dead, further up the road from Elena's. It was clear she had been killed by another animal. WHY did the person not simply knock at Elena's and ask her to take them? WHY put their safety in jeopardy? One precious life lost was unnecessary and unforgiveable on the part of the culprit. Sadly, just a week after she was found and had the promise of a good life ahead of her, our little one passed away on Saturday, 22 June. Unfortunately, many puppies lose their lives when suffering from heavy worm burdens ... their tiny bodies just can't cope with the migration following necessary treatment.
